

International Travel

For our [international](#) travelers you can check the U.S. State Department website by country for specific travel requirements relative to [COVID-19](#). Check this site for [re-entry](#) requirements into the United States. U.S. citizens may want to consider registering for the Smart Traveler Enrollment Program ([STEP.state.gov](#)) so you can receive important information from your nearest U.S. Embassy or Consulate, including alerts and updates to Travel Advisories.

The way things are developing, if you intend to do any international travel [expect](#) to have to be [FULLY](#) Vaccinated ([COVID-19 card](#)) [AND](#) show evidence of a [Negative COVID-19 test PRIOR to leaving the U.S. AND returning](#). [Three](#) things to keep in mind: [\(1\)](#) find out [which test](#) you will need to have; [\(2\)](#) how many hours in advance of travel does it need to be given; [AND \(3\)](#) the form of [payment](#) accepted, especially in a foreign country - you may need to bring extra cash. One [tip](#) - when you get your [COVID-19 card](#) [make a copy](#) front/back and take the copy to a business who can [laminates](#) the card. Put your [ORIGINAL](#) card in a safe place - so when/if it needs to be updated you will still have your original card. I'd also take a [picture](#) of it with your phone.
